In 1914 The Sailfish Club of Florida was founded by a dedicated group of anglers interested in promoting a tradition in Sport Fishing.

This tradition is to promote conservation, sportsmanship and the rules governing the methods of fishing.

The Fishing Committee, consisting of angling members of the Sailfish Club of Florida, holds various fishing activities and challenges for the pure enjoyment of all member anglers.

We encourage members of all skill levels to fish and submit logs.

In order to compete, each angler must know and understand the rules in this book. If any of the rules and regulations are unclear to you, please contact the Fishing Committee or the Club's office at (561) 844-0206.

FISHING RULES

All Sailfish Club of Florida fishing activities shall be conducted under the jurisdiction of the Fishing Committee which shall interpret rules, settle disputes, determine rankings in Club fishing events and disqualify entries not in accordance with these rules.

Any angler dissatisfied with a ruling has the right to appeal to the Fishing Committee and the Board of Governors.

Except as noted herein, accepted methods of fishing, the rules of angling, conduct, and ratings of lines, tackle and equipment shall be those currently used by The International Game Fish Association (IGFA). Copies are available in the Club office or in the Dock Master's office.

Any changes in the rules will become effective at the beginning of the new angling year (January 1).

ANGLING YEAR

The "angling year" will start January 1 and end December 31.

TERRITORY AND TIME LIMITS

Entries are eligible from any part of the world. If adherence to the log due date is geographically unreasonable, the rule will be waived if met as soon as is practicable.

FISHING LOGS

Anglers may submit fishing logs through the following:

- 1. Website: sailfishclub.com "Submit Fishing Logs."
- 2. Download the SFC app from the Apple or Google Plays Stores.

Please be sure to include your full name and contact information on all logs. All information must be completed for the the log to count (including if released on live/dead bait). Please enter only eligible fish. Logs cannot be e-mailed directly to a Club employee and must be entered directly through either the website or app.

Please submit logs within the same month or within 30 days of the fish being released / caught.

Junior and Teen Anglers should include date of birth on the log sheet.

ELIGIBLE MEMBERS TO COMPETE

All members in good standing, spouses and children are eligible and are encouraged to submit fishing Logs. This rule now extends to all members, even those that may be professionals, sponsored anglers and those deriving any income from fishing.

SCORING RULES

Anglers are encouraged to submit all eligible fish released and/or weighed. The current International Game Fish Association (IGFA) Rules and Regulations shall apply in salt/fresh water, in the general division and in the fly-casting division.

POTENTIAL CLUB RECORDS

To apply for a "Potential Club Record," the angler must submit the fishing log including the signatures of the angler and the weigh master.

A quality photograph including the fish, angler, tackle (rod and reel) and the scale used to weigh the fish.

SCORING OF FISH

Eligible fish shall be scored under the following formulas.

Killed Fish

Released Fish

Fish points x 100 ÷ line weight

Fish points $x 100 \div line$ weight x 2

Example: Mutton Snapper on 20 lb line

Example: Mutton Snapper on 20 lb line

 $10 \times 100 \div 20 = 50$ points

 $10 \times 100 \div 20 \times 2 = 100 \text{ points}$

CATCH LIMITS

As of January 1, 2020, "CATCH LIMITS" will be limited to 10 fish per species at a maximum of 3 line classes. You are encouraged to submit all fish, and your top 10 scores will be counted.

BILLFISH

When fishing for any species of billfish, it is necessary to designate the type of bait used (dead, live or artificial). Anglers using dead or artificial bait will receive a bonus (double points) of the score.

FLYFISHING

Anglers receive a 50% bonus on the total points. Please include tippet size. (i.e. 16 lbs leader / 5 lbs tippet). Please refer to the IGFA Rules regarding tippet size.

SPEARFISHING

SPEARFISHING YEAR

The spearfishing year will begin on January 1 and end on December 31.

SPEARFISHING ENTRIES

Entries must be submitted to fishinglogs@sailfishclub.com with the following information: *name*, *date*, *species*, *weight*, *location*, *pole spear / sling* or *speargun*. If you have a photo of you with the fish, please submit it but this is not necessary.

We will have a section on the Sailfish Club website for spearfishing entries in the near future. For the annual lionfish category, please only submit: *name*, *date* and *number of lionfish killed*. The annual award will go to the member who kills the most lionfish.

SCORING

Scoring will be determined based on weight and type of device used to harvest the fish. Fish harvested with a pole spear or Hawaiian sling will be awarded a 20% bonus vs those fish harvested with a speargun. For instance a 30lb. black grouper shot with a pole spear would be awarded 36 points (30lbs x 1.2) and a 30lb. black grouper shot with a speargun would be awarded 30 points.

ANGLER RATINGS

There are two "Angler Ratings" to recognize progressive levels of achievement and promote intra-club competition. Ratings are classified as ANGLER and MASTER ANGLER.

ADVANCEMENT OF ANGLER RATING

To receive an ANGLER rating, the angler must enter 5 different species (1 must be a Sailfish) worth a minimum of 50 points. These species may be caught in either the general or fly-casting division.

For an ANGLER to advance to MASTER ANGLER, the angler must enter 15 different species (5 of which need to be on 12 lb. test line or less) in the general division worth a minimum of 100 points and 5 different species in the fly-casting division worth a minimum of 100 points on 20 lb. tippet or less.

Any angler winning the "Overall Club Champion" will automatically advance to the Master Angler Rating.

MASTER ANGLER*

For an ANGLER to advance to MASTER ANGLER, the angler must enter 15 different species (5 of which need to be on 12 lb. test line or less) in the general division worth a minimum of 100 points and 5 different species in the fly-casting division worth a minimum of 100 points on 20 lb. tippet or less.

AWARDS ADULT DIVISIONS

Anglers cannot win the Overall Club Champion two (2) years consecutively.

DON WILSON OVERALL CLUB CHAMPION

Given in Memory of Mr. Don Wilson to the angler accumulating the most points during the angling year. The winner will qualify for the next higher angler rating.

SAILFISH CLUB SAILFISH RELEASE AWARD

Given by the Sailfish Club to the angler releasing the most Sailfish worldwide.

ANN SODAHL LIGHT TACKLE CHAMPION

Given in Honor of Mrs. Ann Sodahl for her dedication to the Gold Cup to the angler accumulating the most points on 30 lb. test line class or less during the angling year.

ALLAN BONEFISH AWARD *

Given by Mr. and Mrs. Robb Allan to the angler releasing the most Bonefish worldwide.

"HAP" WILSON MARLIN RELEASE AWARD

Given in memory of Mr. Don "Hap" Wilson to the angler accumulating the most points releasing Marlin worldwide. Three points for Blue, four points for Black Marlin, two points for Striped and one for White.

WILSON SNOOK AWARD*

Given by Mrs. Serena Slater Wilson to the angler releasing the most snook worldwide.

SPEARFISHING CHAMPION

Given to the angler accumulating the most points during the angling year.

LIONFISH AWARD

Given to the angler who removes the most lionfish during the angling year.

CHILDREN & YOUTH DIVISIONS

METTLER OVERALL CHILDREN'S AWARD

Given by Mr. and Mrs. Peter W. Mettler, Sr. to the anglers accumulating the most points in the Junior and Teen Divisions.

ANNUAL DOCK FISHING AWARD

Given to the top junior angler who averages the most releases during all four Junior Dock Fishing Tournaments (Easter, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day and Boxing Day).

JUNIOR DIVISION

Anglers ages 10 and under as of January 1st of the angling year.

TEEN DIVISION

Anglers age 11 to 16 as of January 1st of the angling year.

Junior and Teen Division winners may hold their Division Championship for two (2) consecutive years.

The top five Juniors and top five Teens will receive an overall yearly award.

Juniors and Teens will compete within their own divisions for the All-Florida Award. The Fishing Committee reserves the right to add or delete other awards (most Tarpon, most Marlin, most Snook, most Sailfish and fly-casting) as angler participation dictates.

QUARTERLY AWARDS

Given to the angler accumulating the most points in four months of the Angling Year. No angler is eligible for more than one "Quarterly Award" during the Angling Year.

OTHER AWARDS AVAILABLE

COFFIN HEAVY TACKLE CHAMPION

Given in honor of Mrs. Mary K. Coffin and the late Mr. Dexter D. Coffin, Jr. to the angler accumulating the most points on 50 lb. test line class or higher during the "ANGLING YEAR."

NATAROS FLYCASTING CHAMPION

Given by Mr. and Mrs. Frank D. Nataros to the angler accumulating the most points in fly-casting in fresh and saltwater during the "ANGLING YEAR."

FLEMING ALL-FLORIDA POINTS AWARD

Given by Ms. Molly Fleming to the angler accumulating the most points while fishing in the State of Florida.

STOLL OWNER/OPERATOR BOAT AWARD

Given by the Stoll Family to the angler accumulating the most points fishing without professional assistance onboard.

HUNDLEY GRAND SLAM AWARD

Given by the Hundley Family to individual anglers catching the most grand slams caught by an individual in the Atlanic and Pacific. (Blue Marlin, White Marlin and Sailfish in the same day.)

ELLIOTT INSHORE SLAM AWARD

Given by Neil and Kathy Elliott to all individual anglers who qualify for an "INSHORE SLAM" by catching a Bonefish, a Tarpon and a Permit in one fishing day.

FLEMING BACKCOUNTRY SLAM AWARD

Given by Ms. Molly Fleming in honor of Mr. and Mrs. William J. Fleming to all individual anglers who qualify for a "BACKCOUNTRY SLAM" by catching a Snook, a Redfish and a Tarpon in one fishing day.

WOLFE BEST FISH AWARD

Given by the Peter Wolfe Family for the three most outstanding catches during the Angling Year. Best fish are determined by the Fishing Committee. Fish entered by Junior and Teen Anglers are included in this award.

STEWART MOST SPECIES AWARD

Given by Andrew and Catherine Stewart to the angler catching the most species for fresh and saltwater on the Sailfish Club's Eligible Fish list during the Angling Year.
